IMPORTANT DATES

May 9 (Mon)	DEADLINE TO REGISTER TO VOTE
May 17 (Tues)	Last day to apply for an Absentee Ballot by Mail.
May 19 (Thurs)	Last day to apply for an Absentee Ballot in person.
May 23 (Mon)	Last day to hand deliver Absentee Ballot to County Absentee Election Manager. Find your county Absentee Election Manager: bit.ly/AIAbsenteeManager
May 24 (Tues)	Absentee ballots returned by mail must be received by noon.
May 24 (Tues)	PRIMARY ELECTION DAY Polls open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

WHAT IDs ARE ACCEPTABLE?

AL law enforcement agency digital driver's license	Valid AL non-driver ID
AL law enforcement agency digital non-driver ID	Valid AL photo voter ID card
Valid U.S. passport	Valid federal-issued ID
Valid employee ID from federal government, state of Alabama, county, municipality, board, or other entity of the state	Valid student or employee ID from a public or private college or university in any state
Valid military ID	Valid tribal ID
Valid state-issued ID (AL or any other state) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> → Valid pistol permit (photo required) → Valid AL movement/booking sheet from prison jail system (photo required) → Valid AL Department of Corrections release – temporary ID (photo required) 	

WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE AN ACCEPTABLE FORM OF PHOTO ID?

Do not have any of the identification listed above? Receive a FREE Voter ID card at your local Board of Registrars, the Secretary of State's Office, or a mobile location prior to Election Day.

Absentee Ballot

Alabama voters can cast an absentee ballot if they:

- Expect to be absent from the county on Election Day.
- Are physically incapacitated or have a physical disability that prevents a trip to the polling place.
- Are a registered AL voter living outside the county, such as a member of the armed forces, a voter employed outside the United States, a college student, or a spouse or a child of such a person.
- Are an appointed election officer or poll watcher at a polling place other than their regular polling place.
- Expect to work a required shift, 10-hours or more, that coincides with polling hours.
- Are a caregiver for a family member “to the second degree of kinship by affinity or consanguinity” (which means the following relatives: parent-in-law, daughter/son/child-in-law, grandparents, siblings, or grandchildren) **and** the family member is confined to their home.
- Are currently incarcerated in prison or jail and have not been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude.

We urge you to request your absentee ballot and get it back to your election administrator’s office as soon as possible. Visit your county election administrator’s office to get an application or find your county’s application here: bit.ly/AlBallotApp

Please note: Absentee voters need to provide a copy of their photo ID with their absentee application.



Know Your Rights! Under the law, you have a right to:

- Vote if you are in line by the time polls close.
- Vote free from intimidation.
- Receive assistance when voting if you are unable to vote unaided due to blindness, disability, illiteracy, or inability to read English. You can choose who assists you, as long as they are not your employer or union representative.
- Move to the front of the line at a polling place if you are a person with a physical disability or over the age of 70.
- Cast a vote by provisional ballot if there is uncertainty regarding your registration status or eligibility.
- Vote if you are currently incarcerated in prison or jail and have not been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude.

Run into Problems?
