Deadline to request vote-by-mail ballot (request must be received by 5 p.m.). This year we recommend that voters request their ballot by **October 15**

October 31 (Sat)

EARLY VOTING ENDS

November 3 (Tues)

ELECTION DAY

Polls open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Vote-by-mail ballot must be received by the Supervisor of Elections by 7 p.m.

Early Voting Some counties offer additional early voting on October 19, 20, 21, 22 and 23 and November 1. Early voting dates and availability of vote-by-mail drop boxes vary depending on your county. Please contact your county elections office for more information.

WHAT IDs ARE ACCEPTABLE?

FL Driver's License or Identification Card	Federally Issued ID - Including US Passport or Military ID or Veteran Health Card	Student ID
License to Carry a Concealed Weapon Issued Under FL State Law	Employee ID Issued by Federal, State or Local Government	Retirement Center ID
Debit or Credit Card	Public Assistance ID	Neighborhood Association ID

If the picture identification does not contain a signature, you will be asked to provide another form of identification with your signature.

ELECTION DAY CHECKLIST

Wear a mask; stay safe.

Under federal law, you have the right to:

- Vote free from intimidation
- Cast a regular ballot even if you are on the “inactive voter list,” as you are a registered voter
- Cast a provisional ballot if there is uncertainty regarding your registration status or eligibility
- Receive assistance when voting if you are unable to vote unaided due to blindness, disability, illiteracy, or inability to read English; and the right to choose who assists you, so long as they are not your employer or union representative



Under Florida law, you have the right to:

- Choose someone to help you vote if you have a disability and fill out a declaration affirming that you need assistance at the polls
- Vote if you are in line by the time polls close

WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE ONE OF THE ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF PHOTO ID?

If you do not bring identification, you may still vote by provisional ballot and your vote will count so long as your signature matches the signature in your registration record.

VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT

Any voter can request a vote-by-mail ballot. No excuse is needed. Simply fill out the application to request an official vote-by-mail ballot. Then, mail or drop off the application to your county Supervisor of Elections office. We urge you to request your mail-in ballot and get it back to your county Supervisor of Elections office as soon as possible: bit.ly/FLVotersInfo
