WHAT IDS ARE ACCEPTABLE?

GA Driver's License, even if expired.	Federally Issued ID — including U.S. Passport or Military Photo ID.
Free ID Card issued by County Registrar or Georgia Department of Driver Services.	Employee photo ID from any branch, department, agency, or entity of the Federal, Georgia, or local government.
Any State or Federal Government-Issued Photo ID, Including from Georgia public colleges, universities, and technical colleges.	Tribal Photo ID.

WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE ONE OF THE SIX **ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF PHOTO ID?**

Under Georgia law, you have a right to:

- Vote if you are in line by the time polls close.
- Vote free from intimidation.
- Vote and cast a regular ballot even if you are on the "inactive voters" list. In fact, voting is one of the ways to return to active status.
- Ask to vote by provisional ballot if there is uncertainty regarding your registration status or eligibility.
- Avoid waiting in line. If you are 75 years of age or older or have a disability and you are at your polling place between 9:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., you will not be required to wait in line. Tell a poll worker if you want to move to the front of the line. For information on the accessibility of your polling place, please contact your county elections office.
- Receive assistance when voting if you are unable to vote unaided due to blindness, disability, illiteracy, or inability to read English. You can choose who assists you, as long as they are not your employer or union representative.

School Board Elections
Despite receiving little media attention, school boards wield a lot of power. For example, school boards have the power to make budgeting, policy, and curricula decisions, which not only have a big impact on a classroom environment but also help decide the values students receive alongside their formal education.

Here are just some of the school boards having elections on November 2, 2021: Atlanta, Gainesville, Marietta, Decatur, Buford, Calhoun, Carrollton, Social Circle, Valdosta and Vidalia.

Any voter can request a mail-in ballot.

No excuse is needed. Simply fill out the application to request an official mail-in ballot. Then, mail it to or drop off the application at your county registrar's office.
